

Synopsis

Highlighted or headlined by what I consider their most dramatic, thought provoking, eye and mind opening "discovery", namely, that the Book of Revelation is "hung" completely and utterly on a framework that is a "Master Menorah" framework.A "Master Menorah" frame work filled in by "Mini-Menorahs", and also colors and Covenants and all matter of wonderful and enlightening (all puns intended) information.Get all three Volumes at one time if you do not have them yet. Start with Vol. 1, .. don't skip ahead .. really .. it is to cumulative, to building on what has already been written, and way to unconventional to skip ahead on.Their basic premise as the titles indicate is, that much has been lost in the translation from the original Hebrew to our modern day English, especially via the totally different mindset and cultural reality of the Greek / Western mindset / culture and the Hebraic mindset / culture. This portion and it is just a portion of these wonderful books, is in itself worth the purchase price, but there is more, oh so much more.If you feel you are or you want to be, a serious student of Eschatology, and you have not read these three works, I honestly feel that you cannot lay claim to any appellation such as "serious".There is so much "original" thought and information in these three volumes that it is just unbelievable, and I have read dozens of eschatology books, scores of "papers" and articles, visited hundreds of web sites and blogs.I purchased #1 and #2 and read them straight thru during a single day. I was

jumping out of my skin and yelling out loud and finally could not stand it any longer and called my fellow eschatology buff and best friend and just starting going crazy with him on the phone about these two books I had just received from .com and how they were going to totally revise and change and alter .. all for the way, way better .. our thinking on the Book of Revelation, not to mention, many other passages of the Bible that had previously always been a bit unsettling or difficult to really "pin" down. That was two years ago. Volume Three is now just out (Spring 2012) and I finished reading it just a few days ago. These three books are indeed a treasure trove. Do yourself a big, big favor, and get them all. This is my first review ever and I have absolutely no connection to the authors in anyway whatsoever. Eschatology is my lifeblood and these three books gave me a giant transfusion. Enjoy, really .. you will enjoy these books. You may be challenged. An applecart may be tipped over here and there, a sacred cow gored, but you will at the end, be very glad you opened yourself up to the work of these very original and inspiring minds.

I first ordered and read volumes 1 and 2 last June 2011. I learned a great deal from them since I was raised as a typical Protestant and ignorant of the jewish culture and the method in which stories are told and have multiple layers to their meaning used in the bible. I had never understood the Jewish wedding ceremony and what and how it intergrates so many of the stories told within the bible. I had read several books written by authors during the past 50-75 years most of whom were Protestants, some Charismatic in their religious beliefs but none of them incorporated the needed and necessary information about Jewish stories and the Jewish wedding ceremony into their teaching and understanding of the book of Revelations. I have read several translations several times and never got the understanding of the book. It seemed to me to vasilate and change so much that I thought I would never be able to read and understand what the book was explaining and depicting from chapter to chapter in clear and concise way...but that all changed. Volume #3 is the capstone but needs to be read only after you have taken the time to read and understand volumes #1 and #2. If you do read and study all three in consecutive order you'll have an understanding of Revelations that few know. Again I have spent time and considerable effort and money to gain an understanding of this book (Revelations) and until now I have been left often frustrated and tired of being no closer to an understanding of it than when I started, but that has all changed. I now have a clear and succinct understanding of the events in the book as they occur and understand how they interconnect and relate and best of all I am no longer left confused or bewildered. The authors did a wonderful job of explaining the Jewish customs and stories in a way that opens up and gives layers of understanding to many of the stories told throughout the bible and ultimately the most time

specific book in the bible Revelations. Great job guys or as it's written well done good and faithful servants.

Interesting but leans too heavily on a Premillennial Dispensational viewpoint and shoehorns it into a Hebrew point of view, in my opinion. I was hoping for something less influenced by John Nelson Darby. The first book in the series is best and I recommend it, but did not care for books 2 and 3.

I had read volume 1 before I ordered 2 and 3. Like Volume 2 I learned things I didn't know before. It is opening up a whole new understanding. Because one of the reviews was somewhat concerned about the lack of "proof" about some of their conclusions I have also included books by other scholars. I am really going into some depth to understand what the bible means when interpreted by scholars of the original language to english without the mistakes. It also helps to read about the "idioms" and the difference it makes in your understanding of scripture. Worth the read, worth the time, worth the cost and then some.

This book gives an interesting interpretation of the book of Revelation as well as many prophetic passages in the Old Testament. It ties the prophesies together and gives an interesting account of the various kingdoms throughout history. It is well researched and gives another viewpoint to consider. I recommend the book.

I ordered all three volumes. I am not a novice with this subject matter, having studied in this area for about 30 years now. I've read almost half of Vol. One and am LEARNING from these authors. Some things I never knew, others I have believed but had no reason other than "my grandmother told me this" or "the Lord showed me." These men document everything and back it up with the Scriptures. I highly recommend this series to all serious students of our Christian faith who are wanting understanding of our beginnings in this faith. I will likely be reading it all three books again when I get through with the first read..I don't want to forget or miss anything. It is confirmation to what I have believed for a long time.
